Working with Hostile and/or Unco-operative Families

(Level 1)

About this training:

Staff in all agencies may, in the course of their work come across families who are unwilling to co-operate with professionals when intervention or support is necessary for vulnerable children or young people. This course will help participants consider how to engage with families who are not co-operating, either through hostile behaviour or non-engagement.

Aims of this training:

- To enable practitioners to recognise hostile, uncooperative and evasive behaviours;
- To consider how to manage and deal with:
 - Ambivalent / Ineffective Compliance;
 - Avoidance / Uncooperative Behaviour;
 - Hostile / Threatening Behaviour;
- To focus on the impact of intervention of such behaviour;
- To consider how practitioners should behave / respond.

This training will be relevant for all staff or volunteers who work with children, young people and their families and who need to be aware of the Angus Child Protection Committee interagency protocol, "Working with Hostile and/or Unco-operative Families".
